

The preliminary round of the inter-school Times NF Playfest, held in association with Greenwood High. Bannerghatta Campus, unfolded over three days from August 5 - 7. 2025 at SKEI. Oueen's road with over 1200 students from 70 schools across the city partici-

The competition featured one-act plays in two engaging categories - Original and Adapta-

tion - giving young theatre enthusiasts a platform to showcase their creativity and talent. Performances were evaluated by a distinguished panel of judges, each with over 20 years of experience in theatre and children's theatre. All the participants enjoved the ambience at SKE

Speaking of the experience, judge Chandra Keerthi observed that today's Gen Z students are exploring complex narratives - from Chekhov and O. Henry to Tagore and Sudha Murthy. What impressed him the most were the original scripts - honest takes on exam pressure, digital fatigue, thrillers, and sci-fi, many written and directed by students with their facilitators, "Judging NE -Playfest reaffirmed that theatre is not just an activity, but a voice and mirror for young minds in education," he says.

Mahesh Pallakki, adding it was a tough job as judges given impressive performances by students. "We still witnessed amazing plays. Every performance carried its own spark - be it through powerful storytelling. innovative stagecraft, or the enthusiasm of young performers."
